RO CLUJNAP07:

- At Sapientia University the instruction language on the above Subject area is Hungarian.
- Incoming students receive minimum 20 credits/semester in their subject area and they can
 take courses in other study fields, too, but these courses should be offered by the same
 campus (as Sapientia University has 3 campuses in Cluj-Napoca, Târgu Mureş and
 Miercurea Ciuc).
- Orientation week and special workshops and trips are organised, where we provide for incoming students information about region, environment, culture, study opportunities.
 Faculty Erasmus Coordinators together with the study programme coordinators give administrative and academic support.
- Sapientia University is prepared to ensure facilities for people with disabilities or special needs, but we ask students and staff to inform our coordinators previously (in case of students: during the online nomination period, in case of staff members: when applying).

- The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks, provided the documents are complete.
 - Sapientia University will send its decision within 2 weeks of the receipt of the nomination / application in case the nominated / applying student cannot be accepted.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement
 - The institutions decide in mutual agreement on the procedure of modifying or terminating the agreement. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year has to be given.
 - "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."
